The road to Journeyman

National Apprenticeship Week is Nov. 14-20.

Apprenticeship is foundational to careers in line work, substation maintenance, metering and system operations at CORE Electric Cooperative and other electric utilities.

For line work, most candidates successfully complete a pre-Apprentice program. These programs typically take anywhere between four months and two years, and teach the pre-Apprentice how to climb and basics in electrical safety and theory.

Apprenticeships at CORE are Department of Laborcertified and require 7,500 hours – about four years – of paid on-the-job training (OJT). On top of bookwork, Apprentices learn through field and classroom sessions led by experienced Journeyman Linemen. Each year the material and tasks become more challenging to help the Apprentice develop proficiency. Accompanying tests require a score of at least 80%.

Upon completion of the required amount of hours within each designated category, 7,500 cumulative hours of paid training and completion of all tests at 80% or higher, an Apprentice Lineman is eligible to take the final field test and final written test. Successful completion of both earns the designation of Journeyman Lineman.

Four board seats up for election in 2023

CORE offers "the co-op difference": Local, memberowned and not-for-profit. As owners of our cooperative, you and other members have a say in how we do business. You can make your voice heard by running for CORE's Board of Directors.

Our nearly 5,000-square-mile service area is divided into seven geographic districts based on population. Members within each district elect a fellow member to serve a four-year term on the Board of Directors and represent their interests in CORE business and policies. In 2023, the seats for Districts 1, 2, 4 and 6 will be voted on by members within those districts.

Any CORE member interested in being a candidate for a Board of Directors seat must submit a written nomination petition signed by at least 15 members of the cooperative. The petition must be submitted between Jan. 22 and Feb. 21, 2023, and designate the name of the nominee, district and term for which they are nominated. To be eligible, a candidate must:

- Be 18 years of age or older;
- Be a member of the cooperative;
- Purchase electric energy within the director district they are running; and
- Not be an employee of the cooperative.

Ballots will be sent by March 23, 2023, to members in any district in which there is a contested election. Completed ballots must be received by the independent election vendor no later than 5 p.m. Friday, April 21, 2023.

Eligible voters can also vote in-person between 9 and 10 a.m. Saturday, April 22, 2023, before CORE's annual meeting at our headquarters, 5496 N. U.S. Highway 85 in Sedalia. Voting by proxy is not permitted. Ballots will be tabulated and results announced as part of the annual meeting.
