Save on your summer bills

You can play a role in making your home energy efficient. With the summer heat upon us, here are some tips to stay cool and save on your next bill:

Use your windows to keep out heat: install window coverings to prevent heat gain through your windows during the day.

Keep your thermostat higher when not at home. A programmable thermostat allows you to do this automatically.

Turn off ceiling fans when you leave the room.

Avoid placing lamps or TV sets near your thermostat. The thermostat can sense heat and run the air conditioner longer than necessary.

Change the filter on your heating and cooling equipment.


